5B INT. LOBBY - KIRKWOOD HOTEL - LATER

5B

A BELLHOP carries luggage through the lobby. DISCOVER: A simple man, GEORGE ATZERODT (30, German immigrant carriage mechanic, gruff, wheel grease on his skin), is a fish out of water - a peddler MOVING THROUGH the elegant decor and elite GUESTS. He carries A HANDWRITTEN PAPER SIGN: CARRIAGE REPAIRS, G. Atzerodt, Mechanic

He blends into the b.g. as WE DISCOVER Booth -

AT THE FRONT DESK, where a FRONT DESK CLERK rings A BELL associated with VP Johnson's room.

Booth writes on HIS CALLING CARD: Mr. Johnson

Atzerodt comes close to Booth, who slips A REVOLVER to Atzerodt, then shoves him in case anyone's watching. Atzerodt conceals the gun behind HIS SIGN, pockets it, and heads towards THE BAR 'looking for customers.'

Booth flips the calling card over. BOOTH WRITES: 'Don't wish to disturb you. Are you at home?'

BOOTH

For the Vice President.

He signs it: JWilkes Booth and hands it to the CLERK.

6 EXT. SEWARD'S MANSION - NIGHT

6

WIDE SHOT OF THE MANSION. HEROLD and POWELL ride up on Herold's HORSE. They dismount.

HEROLD

Got the gun?

POWELL

I do but it's been jamming.

Herold offers Powell a KNIFE.

HEROLD

I'll need it back for hunting.

POWELL (taking it)
I prefer shooting.

He starts to go.

HEROLD

The medicine -

Powell turns back and Herold hands him A BOX FROM A PHARMACY.

POWELL

Why am I killing this guy again?

HEROLD

He's the Secretary of State.

POWELL

Which state?

Herold can't even entertain the ignorance of the question.

HEROLD

Are you doing it or not?

Powell conceals HEROLD'S KNIFE, takes the package and heads to Seward's front door with his HAT on.

Herold ties up the HORSE to A STAND outside the property. ON EDGE. HEROLD'S POV:

A Black doorman, **BELL** (20s, broad, trustworthy and trusting), OPENS THE DOOR. Powell shows Bell the PHARMACY DELIVERY BOX.

POWELL

Medicine for the Secretary of State.

Bell lets his guard down for a moment, turning his back.

BELL

Did Dr. Verdi mention a delivery?

6A INT. ENTRYWAY - SEWARD'S MANSION - HEROLD'S POV - CONTINUOUS 6A

FREDDIE SEWARD (20s, Dad's protégé) puts on his slippers.

Powell bludgeons Freddie's head. Bell tries to stop Powell. Powell's hat falls to the floor, then he reaches up with Herold's KNIFE and SLASHES Bell's arm! Bell grabs the wound, still trying to block Powell from further entry. Powell runs to the stairs. Bell and Freddie chase after Powell, but they're severely injured. Powell disappears up the steps!

6B EXT. SEWARD'S MANSION - CONTINUOUS

Herold feeds the horse LETTUCE. Through the WINDOWS, Herold sees a vicious fight take place through shadows and light.

His horse's unaware of the TENSION, chewing the lettuce. Herold pets him.

HEROLD

Hope you run fast, city boy.

An upstairs window BREAKS!

Herold is UNNERVED. He unties his horse, hands $\it SHAKING$. He listens. Should I stay or should I go?

12 EXT. SEWARD'S MANSION - MEANWHILE

Stanton's carriage is parked. He crosses towards the front door to learn what happened. Stanton's right hand man, THOMAS **ECKERT** (40, telegraph expert, intelligent and strong), rushes out of the door toward him.

ECKERT

We ran over soon as we heard.

STANTON

How many vandals were there?

ECKERT

They're saying it was one man.

STANTON

Was someone hurt?

ECKERT

Sir, it wasn't just a break-in - Secretary Seward was stabbed.

OFF STANTON --

13 INT. ENTRYWAY - SEWARD'S MANSION - MOMENTS LATER

Stanton enters to DISCOVER a disturbing, chaotic SCENE in the ELEGANT HOME. Blood smeared down the wall by the staircase. A few Union Soldiers listen to SERVANT WITNESSES: A FOOTMAN, A LADY'S MAID, A COOK and A HOUSEKEEPER -- EARNESTLY TELLING THE TALE OF WHAT HAPPENED FROM THEIR POV. Bell - we'll hear from later - is trying to stop his shoulder from bleeding with a blood-stained shirt - no medical attention.

STANTON

(to a nearby Union
 Officer)

Bell needs a medic!

ECKERT

They're on the way.

Stanton starts up the steps. He feels something on his hand on the bannister and STOPS. Looks at the palm of his hand.
